## Notes:

Section 77 of the Competition Act (Chapter 50B) states:

- Any person who provides information to the Commission, an investigating officer or an inspector or any person authorized, appointed or employed to assist the Commission, investigating officer or inspector, in connection with any function or duty of the Commission, investigating officer or inspector under this Act shall be guilty of an offence if
  - a. the information is false or misleading in a material particular; and
  - b. he knows that it is false or misleading in a material particular or is reckless as to whether it is.
- 2) A person who -
  - provides an information to another person, knowing the information to be false or misleading in a material particular; or
  - b. recklessly provides any information to another person which is false or misleading in a material particular,

knowing that the information is to be used for the purpose of providing information to the Commission, an investigating officer or an inspector or any person authorized, appointed or employed to assist the Commission, investigating officer or inspector, in connection with any function or duty of the Commission, investigating officer or inspector under this Act, shall be guilty of an offence.

Section 12Q of the Consumer Protection (Fair Trading) Act (Chapter 52A) states:

- Any person who provides information to the Commission, an investigation officer or an authorised assistant mentioned in section 12I or 12J in connection with an investigation mentioned in section 12G(1) or any offence in this Part, knowing the information to be false or misleading in a material particular or being reckless as to whether the information is false or misleading in a material particular shall be guilty of an offence.
- 2) A person who provides information that is false or misleading in a material particular to another person
  - knowing that the information is to be used for the purpose of providing information to the Commission, an investigation officer or an authorised assistant mentioned in section 12I or 12J in connection with any function or duty of the Commission or investigation officer under this Act; and
  - knowing the information to be false or misleading in a material particular, or being reckless as to whether the information is false or misleading in a material particular, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 3) A person who is guilty of an offence under subsection (1) or (2) shall be liable on conviction to a fine and not exceeding \$10,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months or to both.
